He has been featured in most major art magazines and has been commissioned by Bantam Books for Louis L Amour short story collections and novel, as well as novel versions of the TV show Bonanza. His paintings are collected nationally and internationally, with pieces residing for a time in the United States Embassy in the Netherlands.
